- v. Devotional study

**b) Explain two benefits of studying the Bible daily (4 marks)**

- i. Helps to grow spiritually and strengthens faith
- ii. Guides moral decisions and daily conduct

**c) Using the inductive method, summarize Matthew 13:44-46 (1 mark)**

- The kingdom of heaven is valuable and worth giving up everything else to obtain.

**Question 3**

**a) Explain the origin and consequences of sin (3 marks)**

- i. Origin: Sin began when Adam and Eve disobeyed God (Genesis 3)
- ii. Consequences: Separation from God
- iii. Consequences: Suffering, death, and moral weakness in humanity

**b) Outline God's plan of salvation after the fall (3 marks)**

- i. Promise of a Savior (Genesis 3:15)
- ii. Sending Jesus Christ to redeem humanity
- iii. Faith in Christ brings forgiveness of sins

**c) State two ways Christians respond to God's redemptive work (2 marks)**

- i. Repentance and faith in Jesus Christ
- ii. Obedience to God's commandments

**d) Explain how knowledge of redemption influences daily life (2 marks)**

- i. Encourages moral living and avoidance of sin
- ii. Builds hope and trust in God during challenges

## Question 4

### a) Define “good stewardship” (1 mark)

- Good stewardship is responsible management of God’s resources.

### b) Lessons about stewardship from Genesis 1:26-28 (2 marks)

- i. Humans are caretakers of God’s creation
- ii. Humans are responsible for using resources wisely

### c) Give two examples of good stewardship in school or community (2 marks)

- i. Caring for school property and environment
- ii. Conserving water and electricity in the community

## Question 5

### a) Name two ways God cared for the Israelites during the Exodus (2 marks)

- i. Parted the Red Sea to allow safe passage
- ii. Provided manna and quail for food

### b) Explain how the Passover foreshadows Jesus’ atonement (3 marks)

- i. The blood of the lamb saved the Israelites from death – Christ’s blood saves from sin
- ii. The unleavened bread symbolizes Christ’s body
- iii. The event reminds Christians of salvation and deliverance

## Question 6

### a) Outline how the Sinai Covenant was made (3 marks)

- i. God gave the Ten Commandments to Moses on Mount Sinai
- ii. Moses read the commandments to the Israelites
- iii. Israelites promised to obey God, confirming the covenant

### b) List five of the Ten Commandments (2 marks)

- i. You shall have no other gods before me
- ii. You shall not make idols
- iii. You shall not take the Lord’s name in vain
- iv. Remember the Sabbath and keep it holy
- v. Honor your father and mother

### c) Explain two ways Israelites worshipped God in the wilderness (2 marks)

- i. Offering sacrifices at the tabernacle
- ii. Following rituals and festivals as prescribed in the law

### d) Three modern-day applications of the Ten Commandments (3 marks)

- i. Respecting parents and elders
- ii. Honesty in business and personal life
- iii. Avoiding theft and harmful behaviors

## Question 7

**a) Identify two forms of idol worship today (2 marks)**

- i. Materialism (love for money or possessions)
- ii. Worship of celebrities or sports stars

**b) Outline Elijah's fight against Baalism (3 marks)**

- i. Confronted the prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel (1 Kings 18)
- ii. Prayed to God to send fire from heaven
- iii. Proved that Yahweh alone is God and led the people back to God

**c) Two lessons from Elijah's flight to Mount Horeb (2 marks)**

- i. God's guidance is often quiet, not always dramatic
- ii. Trusting God in times of fear and despair

**d) Three life skills needed to fight social injustices (3 marks)**

- i. Courage
- ii. Critical thinking
- iii. Leadership

## Question 8

**a) Define the terms (2 marks)**

- i. Prophet: A person chosen by God to deliver His messages to the people
- ii. Prophecy: A message from God delivered by a prophet, often about the future

**b) Outline three categories of prophets (3 marks)**

- i. Major prophets – e.g., Isaiah, Jeremiah
- ii. Minor prophets – e.g., Hosea, Amos
- iii. Former prophets – e.g., Elijah, Elisha

**c) Importance of prophets to Israel (3 marks)**

- i. Guided Israelites back to God
- ii. Warned against sin and injustice
- iii. Encouraged hope for salvation and justice

**d) One way prophecy in the Old Testament relates to the New Testament (2 marks)**

- Prophecies about the Messiah (e.g., Isaiah 7:14) are fulfilled in Jesus Christ.

## Question 9

**a) How knowledge of Old Testament prophets guides Christians today (4 marks)**

- Encourages justice, faithfulness, and obedience to God
- Warns against idolatry and moral decay
- Shows the importance of courage in preaching truth
- Strengthens hope that God will deliver and protect the faithful

**b) Two ways Christians can avoid being misled by false prophets (2 marks)**

- i. Compare their teachings with the Bible
- ii. Pray for discernment and wisdom

**c) Short community awareness poster (4 marks)**
